Attendance Matters/ Asuntos de asistencia

Students must attend school. Any student that misses 18 days of school a year is considered chronically absent. Students that miss more than 20 days of school per year will be referred to CPS for educational neglect.

Drop off and Pick Up of Students

- Kiss and Go lanes are for dropping off and picking up.
 Please do not drop off in the red zones and have students exit the vehicle on the curb side of the road.

Kindergarten Expectations

Classroom Behavior Expectations:

Students are expected to...

- arrive on time and attend school everyday (unless sick, check with school nurse when not sure when to stay home)
- pay attention, participate, and complete all work as directed
- always do their best...just try!
- keep their hands, feet, negative comments, and other objects to their self.

Kindergarten Homework Expectations

- Homework folders go home and come back every day.
 - PLEASE Check and clean out the folder out daily.
- Your child will write their name at the top of their assignment.
- Homework should be completed in PENCIL unless otherwise in directions.
- An adult should check the work for neatness and accuracy.
 - An adult should guide the student, not complete it for them
- Letter and number flashcards should be practiced daily.
- Please have the necessary materials at home to complete the homework.
- If homework is not being returned on a regular basis, the student may miss out on some of the fun activities at school.

Kindergarten Reading Expectations

- It is expected that Kindergarteners know ALL letter names and sounds by December 13, 2024.
- All 50 Kindergarten Sight (List 1-5) words should be learned no later than March 14th. We will work on an additional 50 sight words throughout the year, for a total of 100 by May.
 - List 1 will be sent home at PTC on Oct. 14th. As students pass a list, the next will then be sent home.

Kindergarten Math Expectations

- Students are expected to count to 50 by December 15, and 100 by the end of kindergarten.
- They should be able to identify numbers 0-10 by the end of November.
- They should identify numbers 11-20 by the end of February.
- They should be able to add and subtract numbers to 10 fluently by May.

Kindergarten Writing Expectations

- Write first and last name correctly and neatly on the lines.
- Write all alphabet letters correctly and neatly on the lines.
- By the end of Kindergarten, students should be able to write two correct sentences on a single topic independently.
 - This includes sounding out basic words independently, such as cat or pond.

(i.e. The cat is on the rug. It can play with a dog.)
